Spring has sprung, the sun is starting to take his hat off and there are crazy people out wearing flip flops already (I must admit, I've never been a flip flop wearer -I trip myself up in them!).

As we start to emerge from winter, stretch our legs (and shave them in some cases) we must keep some information in the back of our minds when it comes to our dogs. There are a number of things that we need to keep an eye out for to ensure our dogs continue to gallivant around like the cute little lambs and stay healthy.

Here is a list I've compiled of some of the main areas to be aware of, but of course do ensure that you do some of your own research if you're visiting a new place or heading off to the garden centre to get some new goodies.

- Lungworm slugs and snails carry this so ensure your pet is protected
 Don't forget if you put down slug/snail bait...this is also harmful
- **Ticks** gross horrible nasty little buggers ensure you have a tick remover on hand and you can easily deal with them, but if you're not sure pop to your vet and they'll soon sort your dog out.
- **Spring cleaning** If the mother-in-law is visiting then ensure during your mega clean that any extra bleach and harmful chemicals are well out of the way...sometimes it's easier to keep the mother-in-law away instead.
- **Spring flowers** Yup, some of those glorious blooms can cause you to have a very poorly pup see the graphic from the Kennel Club

Inspection for general husbandry skills



How do I get my award?

Once you and your dog are able to complete all the exercises and are ready for your assessment, we can book you in with one of our IMDT Qualified Assessors. You and your dog attend a session and show off the amazing partnership and skills that you've been working on, if you pass, you'll be awarded your certificate and rosette and you can then progress to the next level.

Why should I do more than one level?

Why wouldn't you? Owning a dog is more than just walking it around the woods once a day, it's about celebrating the tens of thousands of years that they've been by our side. The least we can do with such a long-term relationship is ensure that we're doing all we can to continue to nurture and build on it. One of my favourite sayings is "Aim for progress not perfection". Very few things in life are perfect, but if we can keep progressing then we're on the right muddy path with our woofers right beside us.



How do I book?

Head on over to the website and all available classes are listed. New classes start on the first week of **EVERY** month, places always fill up quickly because people continue their training past the first month - they love it so much - you'll need to book to avoid disappointment.



WHAT ARE IMDT PARTNERSHIP CLASSES CONT...?

I'm worried about some of my dog's behaviours?

Recently I put out a survey to the local canine community asking them what caused them the most worry about attending a group class – over 50% of you said you were too worried to join a class because of your dog's behaviour. This isn't the same as having a reactive dog, this is that ONE thing you just can't get to grips with -barking, jumping up, over-excitable – these are all COMPLETELY NORMAL and easily remedied with the help of experts, so come to class – that is the point of a class – to LEARN. We are here to help teach and guide you, enabling you to achieve your canine goals, resolve any niggly behaviours and have a dog that your friends are envious of. Our classes are adjusted to suit EVERYONE and we thrive on seeing waggy tails and smiley faces, so don't let your worries stop you from coming along and joining in!

I have a reactive dog, can I attend a group class?

Please contact us directly, as we will need to assess your situation. If your dog is dog / people reactive, they will probably not be suited to a class environment. The majority of reactive dogs will find a class environment stressful and this means they won't be able to learn. As a human, if you put me in a room full of bugs and creepy crawlies I wouldn't learn the simplest of things because I would be so busy concentrating on what is going on around me. If you have any concerns about joining a group class, then please get in touch with one of our experts and we'll be happy to advise you - dog training is not "one size fits all".

BRINGING HOME A BADGER!

I swore I'd never do it because I was terrified of failure!

But I couldn't resist helping Badger.

I was contacted by his rescuer for an assessment which I was more than happy to do.

Yes, Badger had a couple of little niggles, but nothing that you wouldn't expect from such a young dog with a troubled upbringing, and nothing that an experienced dog owner wouldn't be able to handle.

Little (Not So Little) Badger had two homes in his first 6 months. He'd been labelled as 'dangerous and aggressive' which meant that there were no offers of foster for the little (NSL) lad.

When I heard that Badger had to be placed in kennels, I felt I had to step in and bring him home for a complete assessment and to learn more about him.

Every day Badger opened up a little more and told me a little more about himself; it really is amazing that if you take the time to listen, our animals really do talk to us. I learnt a lot about Badger; his likes and dislikes and, above all, what worried him the most.

By day five I had learnt so much about Badger that on day six he met his new Mum.

I had originally said to the rescue that I would like to have him for at least a month but, as I know his new Mum well, I was 100% sure that it would be best that he went to his forever home as soon as possible – giving him the stability he needed as soon as possible.



BRINGING HOME A BADGER!

Badger (Now called Raffles) has been with his new family for a number of weeks now. He has three doggy brothers and one doggy sister and literally is living the life that every dog dreams of. He's in the most amazing home, with the most amazing family and I cannot wait to see him again and I even hope that one day I'll see him at either a class of mine or an agility show.

Despite friends teasing me about keeping Badger, I knew when I fostered him that I was never going to keep him permanently. I am not in the position to add to my canine family at the moment -I have a LOT going on with work this year (watch this very exciting space – you may even see some sneak peeks in here) so it was lovely to know I could help him and ensure he was happy and ready to go to his forever home and that he wouldn't be stuck in kennels.

What I did learn about fostering is that all you need to have is love to give, along with understanding and patience to listen. As a foster parent, you gain so much as well as helping a dog in need.

I wish Badger and his family all the very best for the future and to everyone else that has ever fostered, whether failed* or not, huge kudos

points to you.



*Note – just in case you're not aware of the term "failed foster" is where the fosterer has failed in fostering and has instead become their forever home and not their foster home

RECIPE CORNER

It can be really hard finding something to suit your dog when it comes to treats. I **ALWAYS** ask students to come to class with something soft and stinky and there's a reason for this!

Soft - because the treat is then quickly and easily swallowed Stinky - because there are lots of smells at the centre and you need to have something to combat the other smells.

Crunchy large biscuits take too long to chew up and they're boring. Of course, you do need to be mindful of your dog's dietary requirements, but I wanted to share with you my favourite thing to make for Alan - who does have a number of dietary requirements due to allergies.

This recipe is so quick and simple!

Pop the sardines and the oil in a bowl and mash it up a bit then add the eggs and mash it up some more.

Then transfer this into a microwavable dish (I use a rectangle one) and cook until the ... sardine omelette as it were is cooked through.



It will depend on the size of your tin of sardines and eggs so you will need to use some common sense. Of course, be careful getting it out of the microwave, it will be hot. I then pop the omelette out of the dish onto a cooling rack and, once it's cooled, I chop it up into small cubes ready for the eagerly awaiting fluffy butts that are around my legs in the kitchen.

So simple to make and I know **EXACTLY** what is going into my dog! Remember, what goes in, must come out, so don't feed more than you need or you'll find yourself in a bit of a situation!

My dogs give these treats a 5 lick rating!

Wendy passing her Agility 1st Instructors exam with a commendation!


